In October 2016, the Army Installation Management Command (IMCOM) transformed its regions within the continental United States into three functionally aligned and co-located Management Command Directorates: IMCOM-Readiness is aligned and co-located with Forces Command at Fort Bragg, N.C., IMCOM-Training is aligned and co-located with Training and Doctrine Command at Joint Base Eustis-Langley, Va., IMCOM-Sustainment is aligned and co-located with the Army Materiel Command at Redstone Arsenal, Ala. IMCOM retains its two regions outside the U.S.: IMCOM-Europe and IMCOM-Pacific.

The realigned organization is smaller and more functionally aligned to be better integrated with the Army Commands it supports. The IMCOM directorates are expected to be more efficient and improve mission command through unity of purpose, a smaller number of garrisons to manage, and similar demographics of communities.

Installation Management Command is transforming to enhance readiness for today's force and the future Army, especially in the areas of mission command, workforce strength and alignment, program/service delivery, and as a change agent to align policies with the current environment.
